



By law, a household good mover cannot transport dangerous goods. Many everyday items such as those identified below, are dangerous articles that could cause serious damage to your possessions.

It is your responsibility to identify and if necessary, dispose of, these items before packing and/or loading, or you can be found liable for any damages that may occur. The packing company has the authority to refuse to ship any articles or items that are considered dangerous or prohibited. Please contact your relocation company if you have any questions.

• **Air Shipments – Batteries of any kind (computers, cell phones, AAA, AA, D, C, etc.)**

- Flammable Liquids/Solids
- Gases – spray cans, medical oxygen, propane cylinders, etc.
- Alcohol – rubbing, cleaning, etc.
- Camphor Oil, Primers & Dyes
- Fluid Cleaners – containing combustibles
- Acids/Corrosives– muriatic, nitric, photographic, sulfuric, alkalis
- Batteries with acid
- Radioactive Materials – radioactive medicines, nuclear metals, etc.
- Disinfectants/Oxidizers – bleach, pool chemicals, peroxides, etc.
- Poisons – pesticides, rat poison, weed killer, fertilizer, etc.
- Flame Retardant Compounds
- Iron/Steel Rust Removal Compound
- Paint and Paint Removing Compound
- Ammunitions, Signal Flares
- Explosive Auto Alarms
- Fuse Lighters, Matches
- Black Powders
- Dynamite, Plastic Explosives or anything similar
- Fireworks, Blasting Caps
- Infectious Substances – bacterial cultures, viral organisms
- Souvenir Explosive Instruments
- Toy Propellants or Smoke Devices
- Other Materials – strong magnets, dry ice, etc.
- Perishables
